

Dame Hannah Rogers left a £10,000 gift in her will in the 18th century to set up a school for poor and unfortunate children from Devon and Cornwall.

221 years on, Dame Hannah`s offers groundbreaking, innovative education, therapy and care to profoundly disabled young people and their families from across the UK.

At Hannahs we want to live in a society where people living with disabilities experience the same opportunities to work, train, learn and live. Hannahs at Ivybridge provides education, therapy, and respite for children and young people with profound physical disabilities. We care 24 hours a day, every day, meaning that at Hannahs, every child grows up in a stimulating and supportive environment.

Hannahs at Seale-Hayne offers an integrated, supportive and vibrant environment with a range of learning, training and development opportunities for young people and adults with physical and learning disabilities.

What a difference your fundraising makes

£30 covers the cost of a session in the hydrotherapy pool

£50 can help us to feed the Hannahs Farm animals where we run weekly sessions, giving people with physical and learning disabilities the opportunity to care for animals and to learn new skills.

£100 buys specialist speech therapy equipment to help a child find and use their voice

£300 Will help us to continue to provide work experience and job opportunities for people with a range of disabilities.

Building a partnership with local schools

Teaching children about disability

At Hannahs, our vision is to live in a society where people with disabilities experience the same opportunities to work, train, learn and live. We imagine a society that advocates recognition and encourages everyone to fulfil their true potential without judgement or limit: a society where disability is incidental

We would like to take the opportunity to share some of what we have learned with local schools to bring awareness to children about the challenges that people with disabilities face and to give them an opportunity to grow and learn through engaging with fundraising to directly support the people that they are learning about.

Hannahs offer the opportunity to support schools in their education and development for students; creating an awareness for disabilities that is part of student's educational experience. We know how important it is for schools to develop the curriculum to include these crucial areas for understanding and learning for students and we think a partnership of fundraising and support is the perfect chance to do this.

How?

Developing a partnership:

By choosing to fundraise for Hannahs at your school, you are just one step towards building a special local partnership; one that is aimed to support the students to grow and learn about disabilities.

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We would like to offer you:

A tailored talk for the students about Hannahs by our trained speaker. This gives an ideal introduction for students to Hannahs as a Charity, where fundraising money goes and how your school and students support the children and adults with disabilities that use our services. Through an engaging talk and short films, the students will get to know some of the Hannahs students and the support that they need on a daily basis.

Session ideas and guides for teaching staff to integrate disability awareness into class time leading up to the fundraising event to allow students to gain develop understanding and knowledge around some of the social and moral topics that may be raised when discussing disabilities.

Activity and fundraising packs for your school to create an effective and successful fundraising day. Activities specifically designed to raise awareness amongst the students including wheelchair challenges, blindfolded ball games, and lip reading challenges amongst many others.

The opportunity for schools to meet Ofsted framework for Equality and Diversity and development of disability awareness whilst supporting Hannahs as a local Charity.

The opportunity for school groups to visit **Hannahs at Seale Hayne**. Students are able to learn more about Hannahs, to find out about the history of Seale Hayne in our 'Safe Haven' World War I project, to meet some of our animals onsite and to take part in our arts projects and learn about the therapies that we provide to some of our guests.

This proved easy to do with Hannah’s as there was a wealth of information on the website and being local to the charity meant that we were able to invite a Hannah’s representative in to school to talk to the pupils involved. Following this our pupils came up with lots of imaginative variations on common fundraising ideas such as; a blindfolded penalty shoot-out, a one armed dressing up race, a lip speaking challenge and a wheel chair race, all of which helped to raise awareness by focussing on a variety of disabilities while also raising money for the charity. The whole event was a great success helping pupils to demonstrate the school’s motto ‘*Optimism, Confidence and Charity*’ at the same time as reflecting the school ethos, supporting the pupils’ PHSME education and, most importantly, encouraging respect for other people in our community.”



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Fundraising Ideas

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Fundraising Online

Setting up an online fundraising page couldn't be easier! Just Giving send your donation straight to us and claims Gift Aid on our behalf. There are many benefits to having an online page you. Sponsorship Forms

We can also provide you with a bespoke sponsorship form, including all the important Gift Aid information. Contact the Fundraising Team to request a form. Remember it is REALLY important to get those that are eligible to tick the Gift Aid option. It is also very important that you keep the sponsorship forms safe and return these to the Fundraising Team along with the money raised to ensure that Gift Aid can be claimed. This can significantly increase the amount you raise.

How to give us the money you have raised...

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Fundraising Event Steps

Step 1: Activity – choose what you're going to do

Step 2: Venue – decide where you want to hold your event

Step 3: Date – choose your date and time carefully, to make sure as many people can attend as possible: will it clash with another local event?

Step 4: Guests – think about who is most suited to your event , and how many people you should invite.

Step 5: Planning – preparation is key to a successful, stress-free event.

Step 6: Budget – Set realistic income targets to make sure your costs are covered

Step 7: Promotion – Use every platform available to let people know about your event

Guidelines

Keep it legal!

There are some rules and regulations surrounding fundraising and events, but don't let this put you off. Just get in touch if you are unsure or have any questions, Fundraising Team 01626 325 838 supportus@discoverhannahs.org

Charity Information

You will need to pop our charity number on all literature asking for money (letters, draw tickets, sponsorship forms). At Hannahs ours is: **306948**

Licences

Depending on the scale of your event and whether you intend to sell tickets, you may need a licence if you intend to provide alcohol, entertainment or hold any sort of large public collection.

Data protection

There are rules governing how to use and store information from people who have donated money. Should you need to do this, you can only use their information how you said it would be used and stored safely until after the event, when it should be destroyed.

Make sure that you get permission from anyone that you take a picture of. You will need permission from a parent before taking photos of children.

Lotteries and Raffles

Lotteries are arrangements where people pay to participate for the chance of winning a prize. A raffle is just another word for a lottery. There are two types which you can organise to fundraise in aid Hannahs.

Incidental Non-commercial Lotteries

This is the most common type of raffle, often using cloakroom tickets. There must be no cash prizes, and the ticket sales and announcement of the results must be carried out during the event. No more than £500 can be spent on buying prizes although there are no limits on the value of donated prizes.

Society Lotteries

If you hold a larger raffle where, for example, tickets are sold over a period of time prior to the draw taking place, the raffle must be registered with the local authority. A named promoter should be nominated to take responsibility for the raffle. If you are planning to hold this type of lottery please get in touch with the Hannahs Fundraising Team on 01626 325838.

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Health and Safety

If organising an event for Hannahs you should use the risk assessment template that we provide as a checklist to ensure that you've thought of any potential hazards. Drop us a line and we can provide you with a form.

First Aid

If holding a large scale event you may need to have a First Aid Service on site. Contact your local St John's Ambulance or British Red Cross for information on how they can provide this for you.

Food

Food safety laws apply when food is available at an event, regardless of whether or not it is for sale. You will need to be aware of food hygiene procedures and these can be found on the Food Standards Agency website at www.food.gov.uk or contact them directly for leaflets and publications on: 020 7276 8829
